The bench book<sup>10</sup> is intended to provide information to all those who come into contact with people with disabilities in court and other proceedings. It aims to ensure that procedures are accessible to people with disabilities and that they are treated fairly and equally by official bodies. In general, it aims to ensure access to justice for people with disabilities and contains practical information and guidelines for working and communicating.

As part of the final activities of the preparation of the bench book, the PIC prepared a document for expressing intention to further cooperate in the preparation and dissemination of the bench book, with a view to ensuring the sustainability of the ENABLE project and its results.

Various stakeholders from different areas of work were invited to express their support. Participants in the meetings of the working group for the preparation of the bench book and participants in the training where the handbook was piloted were invited to sign the letter of intent to further cooperate.

Signatories to the document expressing intention to cooperate can participate in the preparation and dissemination of the bench book in the following ways (but not necessarily):

- internal dissemination of information about the bench book,
- disseminating information about the bench book via the websites of those involved, as well as via social media accounts,
- preparing the presentation of the bench book in peer-reviewed journals,
- organising events to promote the bench book and its use,
- disseminating the bench book by making it available in printed versions, etc.

The signatories to the document shall implement the above within their respective capabilities and capacities.

At the same time, the initiator of the intention to cooperate (PIC) will invite as many representatives as possible from relevant stakeholders working in the field of justice, police, social work, NGOs and others who come into contact with persons with disabilities in judicial and extrajudicial proceedings to participate in the activities of preparing and disseminating the bench book.
